Unit 1**Page 3:**

1. This picture shows that God created the world.
2. God created the world for us so that we could be happy here as we serve Him.
3. (Many possible answers – plants, animals, etc.)

Page 4:

1. These pictures show children working by day and sleeping by night.
2. Light helps us so that we can see to do our work and it helps the plants to grow.
3. We need the night so that we can allow our bodies to rest.

Page 5:

1. The air is all around us. We know because we can feel it and breathe it.
2. God gave air to us so that we could breathe.
3. Rain helps us by making water, watering the plants, and cooling us in the summer.

Page 6:

1. Land, water, mountains, trees. Land plants, water plants (cat tails, lilies).
2. (Student should discuss how the different things help us.)
3. For pleasure – they are pretty, for use – trees and water are important, etc.

Page 7:

1. The sun, the moon, the earth, the stars.
2. The sun is to keep us warm, give us light, give us energy, and help plants grow.
3. The moon helps us by giving us some reflected light. Tides are caused by gravitational pull of the moon.
4. The stars are beautiful, they help us keep track of direction, they help keep track of seasons, etc.

Page 8:

1. Fish: answers may vary. Reptiles: alligator.
2. Blue jay, (others – answers may vary).
3. Birds help us by distributing seeds, eating bugs,

providing food for us.

4. Fish help us by eating bugs and other things from the waters to keep them clean. (Reptiles – answers may vary.)

Page 9:

1. Squirrel, lion, rabbit, hippopotamus, elephant.
2. Answers will vary.
3. God put so many animals in the world for our pleasure and use. Each living creature depends upon other creatures for life.

Page 10:

1. God made people to love and to serve Him in this world (including ruling the world for him) as well as to be happy with Him in the next world.
2. Adam and Eve.
3. Fish, frog, tiger, elephant and birds.
4. Plants, water, mountains, clouds.
5. God wants people to rule His world for Him wisely and according to His will.

Page 11:

1. The picture shows God blessing everything that He has made.
2. All things that God made are good in and of themselves.
3. We can show that all of God's things are good by using them as He meant for them to be used.

Page 12:

1. The children in the picture are picking flowers and fishing.
2. The children are enjoying God's gifts by enjoying the beauty of the flowers, the peace of the little pond, the fun of fishing, the shade of the tree, etc.
3. Answers will vary.
4. We can help other people enjoy these gifts by pointing out how they were meant to be enjoyed and teaching them how to use God's gifts well.

Page 13:

1. The animals are a cow, a sheep, a chicken and a pig.
2. They are farm animals.

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3. They help us by providing us with food and other things. (cow – milk, sheep – wool, meat, milk, chicken – eggs, meat, pig – meat.)
4. We should treat these animals well – give them a place to sleep and food to eat – but we need not make pets of them.

Page 14:

1. The children in this picture are playing with their pets.
2. They are happy because they are enjoying God's gifts as He meant them to be enjoyed.
3. Answers will vary.
4. God wants us to treat our pets kindly – give them a good place to sleep, good food to eat, and play with them.

Page 15:

1. Carrots, peas, corn, lettuce, peach, potatoes, banana, apple.
2. Fruits = peach, apple, banana.
3. Vegetables = carrots, peas, corn, lettuce, potatoes.

Page 16:

1. In the picture flowers have been put around a statue of Our Lady.
2. Plants help make the world beautiful with their many bright colors and interesting shapes.
3. We often use flowers and plants to cut and put around statues or on the altar; we use flower petals in processions; flowers are often sent to cheer the sick in the hospital, etc.

Page 17:

1. In the picture are the sun, the clouds, the mountains, the sea, the rocks and pebbles, sticks and sand.
2. They are different from living things in that they are not alive – they don't need air or food, they don't move by themselves, etc.
3. Answers will vary, stars
4. We need clouds to give us rain, the sun to give us light and warmth, water to live, rocks to build with, etc.

1. The little girl is saying her evening prayers and giving thanks to God for all of His gifts.
2. We should be thankful to God for the gifts He has given us because He did not have to give them to us, they are gifts, but we would not want to be without them.
3. We show that we are thankful for God's gifts by thanking Him and using them wisely.
